Castle Rising Castle

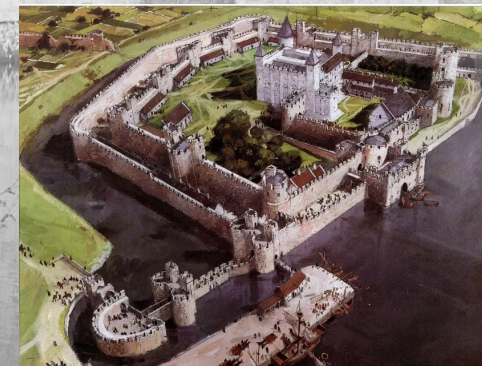
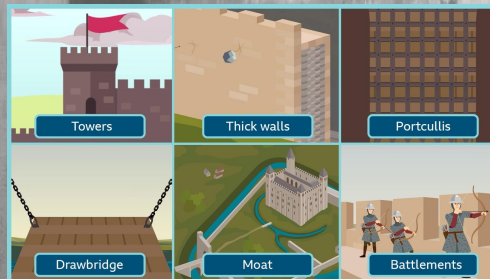
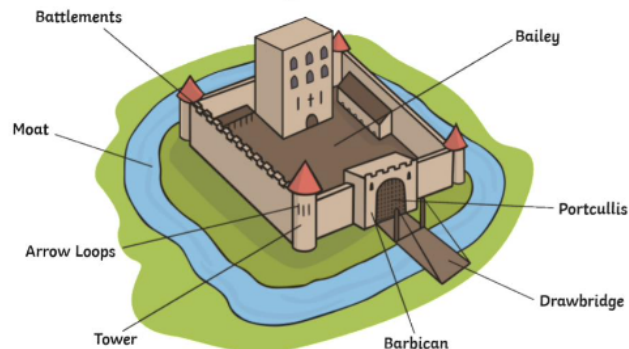
Vocabulary

Tapestry - A large piece of heavy cloth with a picture sewn into it.
Battlements - The top of the castle wall with raised and lowered sections.
Conquerors - A country or group of people that take complete control of another country or group's land.
Defences - Keeping something strong in battle.
Motte - The mound of ground on which the castle is built.
Moat - A deep ditch around a castle
Keep - A fortified/strong tower built within the castle to help defend it.
Bailey - The outer wall.
Invalidate - To enter a country or place by force with an army.
Medieval - This refers to the 'Middle Ages'
Knight - A noble man who served his king or lord in battle.
Taxes - Money that you have to pay to people who rule the country or land.
Revolt - An illegal and often violent attempt to take power.
