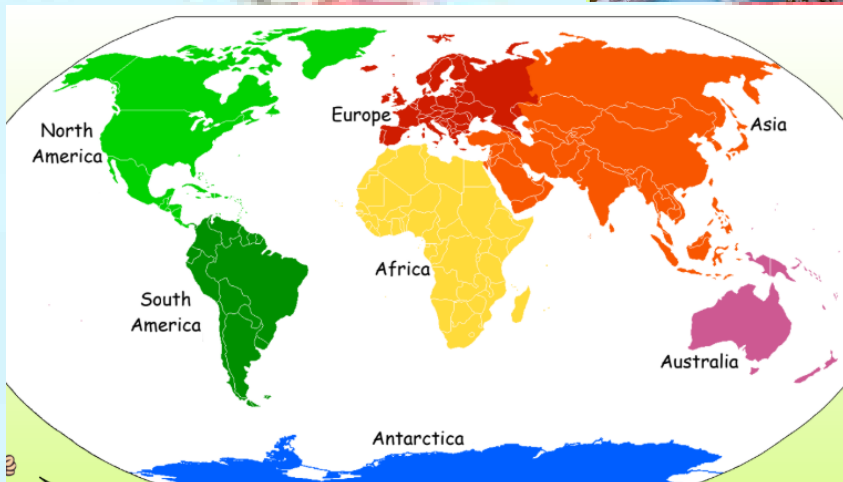
Map Makers

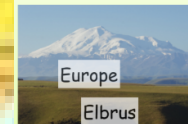
Countries of the World

Continent – expanse of land
